

# Butterfly Necklace

Difficulty - Medium. Some adult assistants required.



## INSTRUCTIONS

1. Print off the Butterfly template (available on page 2 of this tutorial), and cut out each of the three sizes.
2. Choose your Cover Paper colour combinations. Place one of your Butterfly stencils on your chosen colour of cover paper and draw around with your pencil.
3. Now you have a Butterfly design ready to cut out. Use scissors or a scalpel and carefully cut out the Butterfly design. Don't forget to cut two slits in the Butterfly so you can thread your ribbon through later. You may have to change the size of your slits depending on the size of the ribbon you use.
4. Now that you have cut out one Butterfly design, repeat the same steps on the other two template sizes. You can make as many Butterflies, with as many colour combinations as you like.
5. Once you have cut out as many of the Butterfly designs as you want, you will now need to construct the necklace. Firstly stick your first three Butterfly designs together. Start with gluing the medium sized Butterfly to the larger Butterfly. Be careful to make sure your slits for the ribbons line up. If the slits don't line up wait till your glue is dry and cut larger slits in both Butterfly sizes so the slits do line up.
6. Now glue the small Butterfly to the medium Butterfly. Again be careful to make sure your Ribbon slits line up.
7. Once your three sizes are glued together and dry, fold them from the middle slightly so the Butterfly wings angle up.
8. Once you have all your Butterflies finished you are ready to thread your ribbon through. Cut a measurement of ribbon and carefully thread through the slits in your Butterflies.
9. Tie off your ribbon and your necklace is ready.

### Tools:

Ribbon.  
Scissors or a Scalpel.  
Glue stick.  
Pencil.

**A4 Assorted 500 Sheet Pack.** 3 Colours per Butterfly in any colour combination of your choice.
