INSTRUCTIONS

1. Using the Aquarium template (or draw free-hand) stencil out with your pencil as many fish as you like using the yellow and orange Cover Paper (or another colour of your choice).
2. Cut out the your fish using your scissors. Once you fish are cut you can use your black pen to draw eyes (or any other feature) on your fish. Leave your fish to one side for the time being.
3. Now we will make our seaweed, so again using the template provided (or freehand if you prefer) stencil out with pencil your seaweed for your fish tank.
4. Once you have your seaweed stencilled on to your green cover paper (again you can choose any colour you like), cut out using your scissors.
5. Using your black piece of Cover Paper cut out window and leave a black frame. We will stick this one to later
6. Grab your blue piece of Cover Paper, now you can start to glue your fish and seaweed down. Be careful not to go to close to the edge as you will put you still need to put your black frame up and don't want it to cover any of your fish. You can use your black frame as a guide here.

7. Put a nice amount of glue around the edges of your blue piece of Cover Paper and stick your Cellophane down over the top of the blue page and the fish. This will give the fish tank a water effect. Don't worry if the cellophane sticks over the edge. You can cut it back later on.
8. Once your Cellophane is dry you are ready to put your black frame down. Put a nice amount of glue on the back of you black frame and stick down over the top of your Cellophane and blue paper. You should now have a black frame over your Cellophane water effect and the fish swimming behind it.
9. Once your frame is dry enough you can trim back any edges if you need too.

Experiment with different colours and fish types & sizes. You may want to also explore other objects that can be put in your fish tank. Like a sunken ship or a diver.
