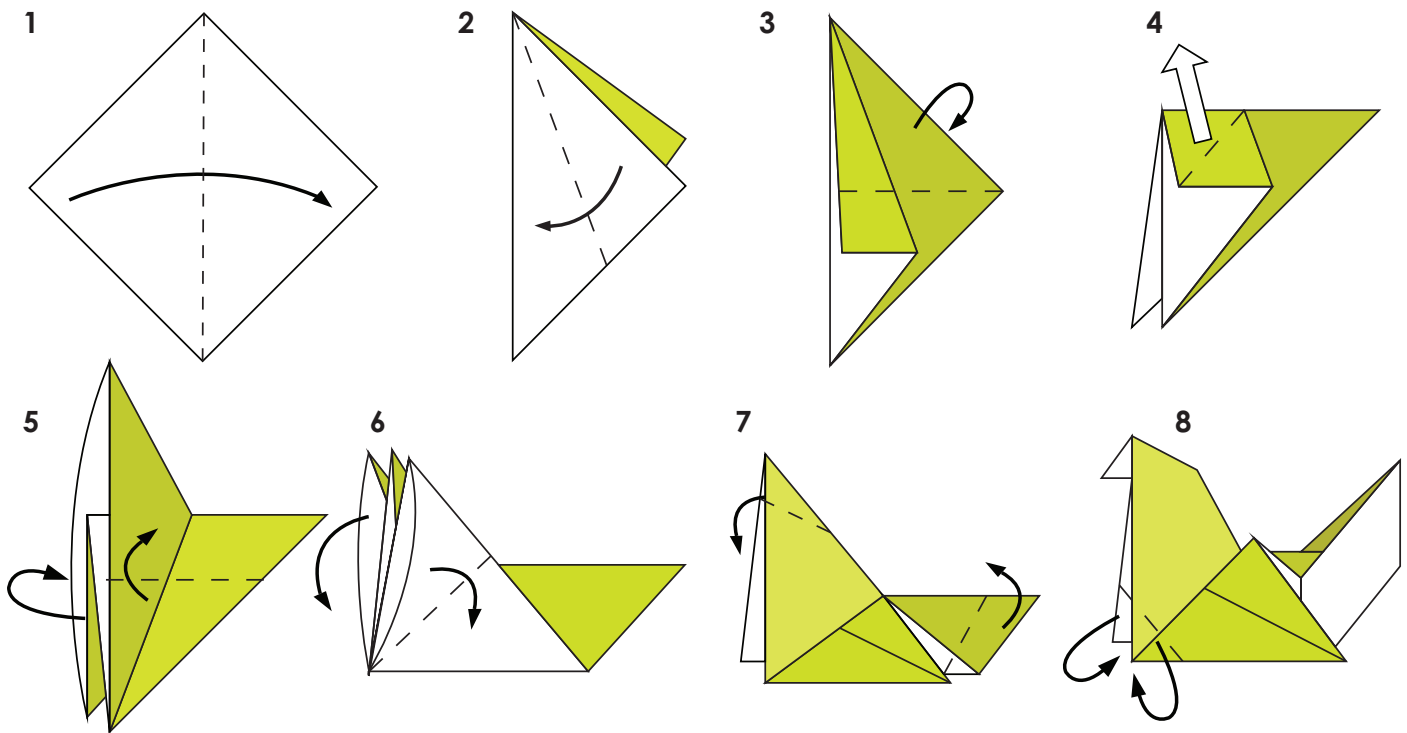


## coverpaper | Pigeon



### INSTRUCTIONS

1. Place the kindersquare paper flat on a surface, with the colour side facing down. Fold the paper in half diagonally to form a triangle. Crease the fold well, then unfold the paper.
2. Fold the paper diagonally again, but this time fold it in half the opposite way, aligning the edges to form a smaller triangle. Crease the fold well.
3. Take the right corner of the triangle and fold it upwards along the dotted line as shown in the diagram. This will form a smaller triangle with an open flap at the top.
4. Fold the Head: Fold down the top corner of the triangle to form the bird's head. This is a simple fold that doesn't need to be exact but should create a small head shape at the tip.
5. Shape the Tail: With the head folded down, fold the left corner inwards along the dotted line. This fold will create the tail of the bird.
6. Create the Wings: Take the top layer of the remaining flap and fold it downwards along the dotted line to form the wing. Repeat on the other side to form the second wing.
7. Open the bottom flap slightly to make the bird stand up. If desired, cutout a small white circle and use black marker to make an eye and glue it onto the bird's head to give it a fun, animated look.
8. Adjust the wings and tail as needed to give the bird a balanced, standing posture.

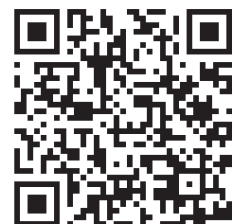
